
Alumni With MVHS Concert Choir

History of Mount Vernon Theater

The first drama club at Mount Vernon High School was organized in 1925 under the supervision of principal Seville Gaston to "encourage the dramatic arts in the high school." The first joint program of the dramatic club and music organizations occurred two years later. In 1934 the name Velvet Curtain Dramatic Club was formally adopted, but used inconsistently for several decades. By 1937, the dramatic society was also hosting declamatory contests. The Velvet Curtain title largely fell out of use upon the awarding of a charter from the International Thespian Society in 1972. That year also saw the first recorded mention of Mount Vernon attending the state Thespian convention, precursor to the Iowa Thespian Festival. Troupe 1470 continues today as a proud member of Iowa Thespians and the Educational Theatre Association. In 2012, as a nod to the past and present, the MVHS Theatre Department rebranded as the Velvet Curtain Dramatic Society to encompass our work as actors, technicians, orators, and thespians.

How to make a Mount Vernon Quilt

Editor's note: The following article was written with help from Rebecca Delaney's article in the February 5, 1998 Mount Vernon Lisbon Sun.

Tucked away in Steve and Mary Young's attic was a quilt created by part of the class of 2005 in 1998 as a class art project with photographer Bob Campagna. "I stored it in my attic. My daughter, Beth was part of the 2005 class," said retired MVHS teacher Mary Young. "When I was subbing recently, I noticed a newspaper article about the quilt in a display case outside the PAC. I thought the quilt should go with the article."

In 1998, 27 students in Sheryl Peshek's fifth grade class at Washington Elementary School took time out from their books and the classroom to work on a historic project for the Mount Vernon community.

Parent volunteers drove the students in groups of six to Bob Campagna's Mount Vernon photography studio, Abbe Creek Gallery, where the students printed the photographs they had taken of their classmates, their parents, their friends and neighbors. Claudia Ternes used the squares to create a quilt that displayed the students' photographs.

Said Campagna in back in 1998, "This is an artistic, timely and visual project, one which I believe will benefit the community and represent its history through the eyes of fifth graders,"

The fifth graders took 2 photographs, six of the two different subjects. One of the subjects had to be a classmate. The other subject had to be someone outside the classroom who had made a difference in the student's life.

Lauren Penn Oliphant '05 snapped a picture of her grandmother, Judy Penn. "I picked my grandmother because she has lived in Mount Vernon practically her whole life."

The quilt contains 54 pictures total and features the work of Bryan Osborn '05, Lena Brandt, Leif Stensland '05, Jammie Lowe '05, Daniel Holland '05, Jeremy Clark '05, Geoff Glenn '05, Beth Young Arjona 2005, Jillian Diesburg, Colt Beall, Candace Stone,



A hundred years from now, the descendants of today's residents can see real estate agent Lee Neiderhauser sitting in her office or music teacher Catherine Kennedy at her piano or Big Creek Market proprietor Karen Thorton in her store. They can look into their eyes and see what Mount Vernon was like 100 years before their own time."

While it has not been 100 years, the class of 2005 will have their 20th reunion next year. The quilt will be in the alumni display case located in the Performing Arts Center lobby throughout the next year and then shared with the class of 2005 at their 20th reunion in 2025

What have you been doing since you left Mount Vernon High School?

I graduated April 14th, 2023 Summa Cum Laude from Northwestern Health Sciences University in Bloomington, Minnesota as a Doctor of Chiropractic with a Sports Emphasis. I had the honor of being the chiropractic student speaker at commencement. Following graduation I moved back to Iowa and began working as an associate chiropractor in North Liberty. My training was specialized in rehabilitation and therapeutic exercise; extremity care as well as spinal care; tailbone pain and dysfunction; and physical laborer prehab and ergonomics. I also participated in research on female youth athlete injury prevention and placed second in a national competition with the American Chiropractic Association Sports Council for the research.

One of the first adventures I took as a chiropractor after graduation was actually 8,000 miles away in Nairobi, Kenya in the summer of 2023. During our 3 week trek, we visited several rural areas outside of Nairobi treating several hundred students, teachers, and staff at 5 different schools. We also spent a whole week treating another couple hundred patients at the Kilimanjaro Mission Hospital that is graciously funded by people all over the United States. This was my first global missionsfocused trip. Others may relate as I left on the trip with the attitude of immersing myself into their culture through the act of service, but returned feeling like I was the one filled up. Though the vocal language barrier was strong at times, the smiles and joyful reactions that shined after treating with our hands was

well understood - and a favorite of my experiences.

What do you do now?

Since graduation and my adventures in Kenya, I continue to work in North Liberty at Humpal Chiropractic. I work with patients of all ages from newborns to those actively aging and everyone in between. Seeing my patients not only get out of pain, but reach their functional goals is my favorite part of my job. Everyone has something to train for whether they sit at a desk, take care of their family, labor on the farm, or play on the field every week. To keep up with the latest research related to the care I provide, I am a member of the American Chiropractic Association's Sports Council and their Research Committee. I am also an active member of the Iowa Chiropractic Society to be sure Iowa state laws and legislature support my patients.

On a day off, you might catch me at Kroul Farms working in the garden or greenhouses, volunteering at the North Liberty Community Pantry, or helping out at a Mount Vernon High School softball practice!

Being back in the area, I am very excited to connect more with Mount Vernon, North Liberty, and surrounding communities!

Since graduating from Mount Vernon in 2018, Haley Krob is now a mixed media artist based in Milwaukee. She graduated with my BFA from the Milwaukee Institute of Art & Design in 2022. Krob worked on the Riverwest Mural Project, shown work in the Morgan Conservatory, Aquae Nguvu, and was selected for the North American Hand Papermaker's 8th Collegiate Triennial Exhibition.

In 2023 Krob became one of twelve selected to be an Artist in residence in the Milwaukee River Greenway. Krob among 12 artists participating in a year-long residency program called ARTservancy, a collaboration between Gallery 224 in Port Washington and the Ozaukee Washington Land Trust, River Revitalization Foundation, Milwaukee Area Land Conservancy, Tall Pines Conservancy, and Lake Michigan Bird Observatory. The mission of ARTservancy is to promote the visionary work of both the artists and conservationists. Each artist has selected a preserve to spend time in and to engage with.

Krob's artist statement notes: "Despite all the awareness surrounding climate change and humanity's impact on the planet there still is a tendency to forget that we humans are a part of the natural world as well. We separate ourselves from nature as though we aren't biologically, physically, and spiritually intertwined. In my work I explore the connections that exist in the natural world and the complex relationships between humanity and the planet. I depict the inherent connection that we have with the Earth within landscapes through drawing, printmaking, and a mix of cut paper colored with natural dyes. Materials foraged outdoors help remind me of my own connection to nature, while using recycled and biodegradable materials serve as a reminder of the footprint I leave behind.

The Milwaukee River Greenway trails have been familiar and comforting places since I moved from my rural lowa hometown to Milwaukee. There's

a lot of repetition in the act of following the trails along the river, and yet, through this residency, I've been able to experience a place I thought I knew in a whole new way. I was amazed by the nature I'd been missing out on every winter that was spent tucked in an apartment, waiting for spring.

Though the leaves have fallen and the foliage has all died back, covered in a thick white blanket of snow and ice, in winter the lichen was almost glowing as it danced up the trunks and along the branches of trees. Even moss, still green, peeked out in little areas, hinting at the impending awakening of forest.

As the season changed to spring, buds slowly sprouted into leaves over the course of a week or two, and yet the change seems to happen in the blink of an eye. The moss and lichen, though still present, faded into the background as spring erupts into summer and wildflowers begin to bloom. Throughout all the changes, the river stays constant. Though the water is slightly frozen over in the winter, it never stops moving, accompanying you along your journey through the winding paths.

At the same time, the sketches and photos I took along the way went through their own metamorphosis. My goal was to make the body of work reflect the changes and discoveries made throughout these last months, creating the feeling of a journey where certain elements seem to fade, yet not disappear, and each individual journey on the same path leads to its own conclusion."

"The Arizona Peace Trail! It's a rugged, 750-mile off-highway vehicle (OHV) adventure that draws thrill-seekers from all corners of the world. Lucky for us, we live quite close to the trail.

As a member of the class of 1958 and thought I would share our Peace Trail run with you. We recently made the run with a crew of fellow riders, including Bruce, Joe, Denny, and Turbo Denny. Joe was the mastermind behind the logistics, and he had a good plan for our run. As a Muhlenberg student, Sam White had a transformative experience studying abroad in the Buddhist kingdom of Bhutan. White spent three months in this country that sets strict limits on tourism in the interest of protecting its environment and culture. She chose Bhutan partly because of an interest in sustainable development she developed in her political science classes. Another deciding factor: the Himalayas. White got involved in the Rock Climbing Club and the Outdoors Club at Muhlenberg to enjoy Pennsylvania's varied terrain. Bhutan is the most mountainous country in the world.

"The opportunity to spend time surrounded by snow-capped mountains was so cool to me," she says. "Mountains pose a physical obstacle to development in Bhutan. Anything that's not able to be made or grown locally has to be shipped via flight. They're posed with unique environmental challenges when it

comes to development, but they've also chosen to develop in a different way than most countries. The government prioritizes cultural and environmental preservation alongside economic growth. The Bhutanese are so supportive about protecting the environment to an extent that I don't think really exists in other places."

"Sam is continually forging intellectual and social connections, which makes her a real asset to an educational and ambassadorial program like the Fulbright. I can easily imagine her thriving in a Mongolian school, deepening her understanding of Buddhist culture and her commitment to the environment, and developing close learning communities with her students and colleagues," [Associate Dean of Academic Life Kammie] Takahashi says."I'm really proud of the months of hard work she did on her Fulbright application and excited about the positive impact her work there is certain to make."

White learned that she was a finalist for the award in March, and she'll leave for her 10 months in Mongolia this fall. Her long-term goal is to work in sustainable development, but first, she's embracing the chance to have another impactful long-term stay in a new country.

"From studying abroad, I gained a newfound appreciation for how important it is to really spend time in a place. I don't know if I'll be able to one day just travel abroad for a couple of weeks, because I learned how important it is to get a more intimate understanding of the country that you're spending time in," White says. "The opportunity as a Fulbright scholar to spend an entire 10 months abroad was a huge draw for me."

Imagination Library Coming to Mount Vernon

The Friends of the Lisbon Public Library are expanding their Dolly Parton's Imagination Library affiliation to encompass Mount Vernon. This will be the first year Mount Vernon children are eligible to participate in the local program serving about 70% of Lisbon's eligible children since its inception three years ago.



Dolly Parton's Imagination Library (DPIL), the preeminent early childhood book gifting program globally, has distributed over 200 million free books. This initiative, led by The Dollywood Foundation, aims to foster a lifelong love of reading and inspire children to Dream More, Learn More, Care More, and Be More®.

DPIL is free to any child from birth to age five. Registering is easy. Parents can register their child/children online at bit.ly/DPIL-LMV. People can donate to the cause at this link as well.

Michelle Platt, president of the Friends of the Lisbon Public Library, said the group signed up their first child from Mount Vernon at the end of February and are now rolling out a variety of easy enrollment options.

"We have the goal of enrolling one-third of eligible children in Mount Vernon in the first few months," Platt said.

"Dolly Parton's Imagination Library helps establish a love of books in our youngest community members," said Amy White, recently retired Lisbon Library Director. "Seeing the joy these monthly gifts bring to their children is a gift to their caregivers and families. Our hope in providing funding for this outreach program is to nurture a love of books and to create a connection between families and their public library

RISE program

Wrapping up this year's tax season brings to light recent tax changes to our retirees. Starting in 2023, retirement income (pensions, annuities, IRA, 401K distributions, etc) and farmland rental income for certain retired farmers is exempt from lowa income tax. When our retired community members filed their 2023 taxes this spring, they may have noticed the savings. Though initially this change may not be major to the school districts in lowa, the retirees will have noticed the personal benefit. Long-term, some of the recent tax changes can have larger implications for education funding. For those interested in using some of their tax savings to help our school district, there is a new local effort called RISE.

Retired Iowans Supporting Education (RISE) is a campaign being led by Dick and Deb George encouraging voluntary annual pledges to our district by retirees. The George's and other local retirees are planning to use some of their income tax savings to help support the local school district by making tax deductible gifts to the Mount Vernon School District Foundation. With the support of education in mind, the donor would make a donation to a school fund and offer allocation suggestions from a provided list of current school endeavors they wish to have their support go towards. This list will be kept up-to-date and includes specific programs, the District's general fund, current projects, or the Foundation's long-term endowment. The pledges can be directed on an annual basis, allowing the donor to tailor their gift allocations and amounts each year.

The goal of the RISE campaign is to help offset current and long-term public school funding shortfalls from the State of lowa with some of the income tax savings on retiree income. The hope is that our retired community members wishing to support education can still do so in a tax beneficial way from this annual savings, allowing minimal impact on their current household income. Donors are always welcome to give in different ways, as well, such as time and other non-monetary support. This summer an informational meeting will be held for those wishing to learn more about this opportunity.
