

At the top of the Cedar Rapids Athletic Officials Association overview packet in bold letters says: "The game is for the kids - not the coach or the officials." Our **2024 Achievement Hall of Fame Recipient Bill Yeisley** spent his life training educators, referees, students and players to play a fair game "for the kids." Bill Yeisley 1952 was nominated by his sisters Rachel Yeisley Miller '54 and Gail Yeisley Rhodes '58.

Bill Yeisley's life has been marked by dedication to both education and athletics. Born and raised in Mount Vernon, Bill was not only a standout student but also an active participant in numerous extracurricular activities. He played football for two years, basketball for three, and excelled in track for four years. Beyond sports, Bill's interests extended to the arts and leadership. He served on the student council, was a member of the school newspaper staff, and participated in the Velvet Curtain Drama Club. He was involved in both mixed chorus and boys' chorus, along with playing in the band and drum ensemble. He lettered in football and track, performed in leading roles in school plays, and earned a State Superior Performance Rating for his senior-year operetta.

After graduating, Bill attended Cornell College, earning his Bachelor of Arts in 1957. He continued his education at the University of Iowa, where he received his Master of Arts in 1964. After college, Bill began his successful career as a classroom teacher and coach, serving in that role for 11 years before transitioning into school administration. For 27 years, he was an elementary school principal in Marion, Iowa, until his retirement in 1995. He married Harriet Yeisley in 1952. The couple have two daughters, two sons in law, and four grandchildren.

Most people know Bill through his work officiating sports. For 34 years, was a registered official with the Iowa High School Athletic Association (IHSAA), officiating in football, basketball, and baseball. His expertise and dedication led him to officiate at the Iowa High School Football Playoffs for 23 years, including five state championship games. In 1992, Bill was selected to officiate the Iowa Shrine Senior Bowl Game. He was inducted into the Iowa High School Officials Hall of Fame in 2001.

Bill has also been an active member of the Cedar Rapids Area Officials Association, where he served in various leadership roles. He has been the training coordinator for new football officials and acted as the coordinator for football rules study presentations, ensuring that new and experienced officials alike had the tools to succeed. Yeisley's years of experience as an educator helped him train new officials. Under Yeisley's training, referees started in Middle School games before working their way to Varsity Games. He coached officials through the process and helped them understand the entirety of their roles. In 2015 a Cedar Rapids Gazette article Bill said, "A lot of people don't realize how good of shape referees need to be in," Yeisley said. 'They are running up and down the field as much as the athletes."

Among his many accolades, Bill has been honored with the prestigious Distinguished National Contributor Award by the National Federation of High School Officials in 2003 and was named the Iowa Football Official of the Year in 2005 by the National Officials Association. He published a paper on mentoring in the National Federation of High School Officials Quarterly Magazine, for which he received a merit award in 2000.

For nearly three decades our fine arts award recipient has

provided customized art solutions for highend residential and corporate collections. Our 2024 Fine Arts Award Recipient is Jude

**Smith** '81. She was nominated by her classmate and fellow designer Rhondi Ewing '81.

In High School, Smith was involved in cheerleading and art classes. Said Smith about her time in Mount Vernon, "The direction and course I have taken in my life is due to one remarkable high school art teacher - Donna Swenson. Donna believed in us and as I reflect today I can't help to wonder how differently my life would have played out if she wasn't so adamant that I attend Mt. Mercy College and receive an art degree." In addition, Smith was a Mustang cheerleader for football and basketball. "The two go hand in hand with where I'm at in my life today."

Jude received a BA in Art from Mt. Mercy University and started her art career at the Corner House Gallery in Cedar Rapids before forming her own company in 1993. Today Jude is an art consultant and art advisor in her business The Art Makery.

Using both her art and people skills first honed at Mount Vernon, Jude has had to learn and utilize many skills including establishing a network of artists, establishing a network of customers, and creating a network of contractors. In addition she is a project manager for each installation where she has an eye for detail and impeccable planning skills.



Jude links artists and their work to new or redecorated commercial properties, primarily for hotels, nationwide. Her projects include Marriott Hotels in Phoenix Az, Tempe AZ, New York City, Irvine, CA, and Oklahoma City as well as corporate and private properties all over the country

Jude is an art curator specializing in creating captivating visual experiences. As an expert in art history, techniques, and market trends, Jude brings a deep understanding of the art world to her projects. She excels at building relationships with artists, interior designers, architects, and hotel management to create cohesive and appealing environments. Her ability to assess the value of artworks and anticipate trends ensures her clients receive pieces that not only enhance aesthetics but also add market value. Her skillful curation leaves a lasting impression, blending art with hospitality.

For most of her life, Jude lived in Scottsdale Arizona with her husband Greg Rupp, who is a professor of chemical engineering at Arizona State University. "My work has taken me all over the world, but I have never forgot-

ten my roots." One of her most recent projects brought her back to her roots. She recently completed restoration and redesign of a building here in Mount Vernon. The now beautiful building includes a storefront downstairs and upstairs living quarters for Jude's family.

Longtime Alumni Association
Director Kathy Staskal said
"Because of her reputation in this
industry and the many talents
she possesses to make The Art
Makery successful, I believe
Jude is well deserving of a spot
in the Hall of Fame." Said nominator Rhodi Ewing, "When I think
back to us taking art classes with
Donna Swenson at MVHS, and
I look at her today, I know that
Donna would be SO PROUD of
her, as am I."

James Moore's family has a history of service as old as the United States. When he enlisted in the United States Air Force in 1954, James continued a 235 year tradition of military service. It is that service that defined

the life of Reverend, Doctor, Representative, and Colonel James Moore '53.

Our 2024 Service Hall of Fame Recipient James Moore was nominated by his sisters Kathy Bearce '58 and the late Treva Heiser '50. He will be represented at the ceremony by his son, Lieutenant Colonel Robert Moore.



Jim spent his youth in Solon and Mount Vernon, Iowa and graduated from high school in May 1953. Growing up on a farm taught Jim how to work hard, but he set his sights in a different direction the minute he hit the clouds. At just 16, he began flying lessons.

After a brief stint at the University of Iowa, Jim enlisted for 4 years in the US Air Force on February 15, 1955. The Air Force greatly added to his lifelong character - he loved uniforms, pomp & circumstance, orderliness & organization. Quite frankly, he loved his country and everything it stood for.

While on leave from Chanute AFB in Illinois, Jim's best friend introduced him to Elizabeth Marie Shaw who was attending Cornell College in Mount Vernon. Jim was so love struck, that at the end of his enlistment he began attending Cornell College with her in the Fall of 1958. They were married in June 1959 and moved to Denver to begin their family. They had 5 sons - Robert, James, John, Thomas, and Timothy. In Jim's own words from 2014, "I consider my wife of fifty-five years along with our five sons, their wives and children to be my greatest responsibility and blessing. My belief system has been tried, improved and tested over the years. There is no greater joy than to see righteous children take their place in contributing to a productive society. My family is my success."

Jim and Beth moved to Colorado where he continued his education at the University of Denver. Jim completed his bachelor's degree in 1971 from the University of Denver, a masters in 1977 from the University of Northern Colorado, and his doctorate in 1990 from Pacific Western University. He taught business and business law at the Community College from 1975 until his retirement in 1995.

Jim was on the merit badge committee, finance committee, and the Order of the Arrow, for Troop 57, Timberline District, Jefferson County Colorado. He was

City of Lakewood, State of Colorado and National badge counselor and a member of the BSA Court of Honor. He guided his five sons as well as many other Scouts to reach the honor of Eagle Scout.

Jim also volunteered to encourage the ROTC cadets at the University of Colorado to take pride in the military and to share the joy of flying as Jim took them flying in his private airplane. He continued flying, served in the Civil Air Patrol, and served in the Colorado legislature for four years

After a lifetime of service, Jim went on to serve in the US Air Force Reserves. He was commissioned to serve in the United States Air Force Auxiliary in June 1987 and received an ecclesiastical endorsement as a chaplain from the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. He served in many capacities including squadron chaplain, group chaplain, wing chaplain and ultimately as Chief of Chaplains overseeing operations for 800 chaplains of all faiths. As squadron, group and wing chaplain duties were the moral and spiritual advisor for the commander plus personal training for the youth called cadets.

He served in numerous assignments within the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, served with wife on a full time religious mission in Texas, and in the Denver LDS temple. Jim passed away in 2014 but his history of service to his family, his faith, and his country remains an enduring legacy.



Tom Wilkinson wears many hats in the Mount Vernon community – family man, alum, teacher, and coach. His many hats have changed the Mount Vernon Community. Our 2024 Mount Vernon Community Impact Award goes to Tom Wilkinson '86. He was nominated by his daughter Emily Wilkinson Vislisel 2009.

Tom grew up in Mount Vernon and graduated in 1986. Said Tom, "My senior year was probably most memorable. With encouragement from some of my friends, I joined the choir and got involved in drama. I never felt I was a strong singer, but I had a lot of fun. In theater I tried out and got some small parts in a couple of plays and a musical."

Teachers understand teachers. No surprise, Tom had many favorite teachers at Mount Vernon. "I have many strong memories of my teachers at Mount Vernon. No one teacher was everything for me, but together they have made a significant impact on the course of my life."

Tom moved to Phoenix, Arizona after graduating with his BA from Loras College. One year, he returned home for the holidays and ended up changing his path completely. Principal Tom Madson found him and explained that the High School needed a German teacher in the middle of the year. Tom accepted the position and has been in Mount Vernon ever since. Said Tom, "I've looked at other school districts at different times and had offers to move, but in the end I couldn't find anything better for me and my family."

Soon Tom wanted to make a difference with students beyond the classroom. Said Tom, "Research showed that students who had more engagement beyond academics, usually made greater progress and had more feeling of connectedness to their school. As I tried to think of ways to get students engaged I had already started reconnecting with family and hunting traditions. I got interested in involving students in the shooting sports of trap shooting and archery." In 2006, Tom started a small archery club with a handful of participants. Soon the club grew into the Mount Vernon Archery Club, a significant program with over 140 students from grades 4 to 12 at its peak.

Tom went on to become a certified USA Archery Level 3 Coach. As a coach, Tom embraced the philosophy of the Positive Coaching Alliance,

which encourages "double-goal coaching"—striving to win while focusing on teaching life lessons through the sport. Under Tom's leadership, MV Archery emphasized personal growth, teamwork, and character development. For Tom, success isn't just measured in trophies or titles; it's seen in the development of young individuals into confident, capable adults.

Tom retired as Mount Vernon Archery Coach in 2018. Today, he continues to coach individuals and instruct beginning and intermediate level coaches as well as compete in summer and winter leagues and state competitions. He has coached several individual archers to the podium in state and national NASP championships.

Tom's jobs today also include a new hat – Grandpa. "Today, my grandsons Cody and Lucas are at the center of my world. They go to Washington Elementary and are in Kindergarten and 2nd grade. I see them almost every day before school and after school. I'm thankful to have my daughter

In 1984, Jeff Dahn, sport reporter of the Mount Vernon Sun said, "Wayne Hormann was a powerful force for the Mustangs all season" Our 2024 Athletics Hall of Fame Recipient Wayne Hormann has been a powerful force in Mount Vernon his entire

life. Hormann was nominated by his wife Jodi Hormann, Dave Ryan '85 and Jeremy Hotz '99.

Wayne Hormann's football career is one of dedication, versatility, and excellence, both on and off the field. Said nominator Dave Ryan "Hormann was old school tough....probably would have enjoyed playing football without a helmet. He was one of the best offensive blockers and defensive tacklers of his era. I recall he was equally tough on his teammates setting the tempo in the huddle with raw intensity and piercing stares that made everyone around him a better football player."

In 1983, Hormann was a unanimous first-team, two-way Eastern Iowa Hawkeye Conference selection, excelling as both an offensive guard and a defensive lineman. His relentless play earned him a spot on the Quad City Times Eastern Iowa All-Star First Team as offensive guard and a place on the Des Moines Register's Class 2A Second Team All-State. Wayne led the team with impressive 64 tackles in just nine games and was instrumental in guiding Mount Vernon to an 8-1 record. The following year, Wayne continued to excel on the football field. This time, his talents earned him a spot on the Iowa Newspapers Associa-

tion Second Team All-State (across all classes) for his defensive play and Des Moines Register's Class 2A First Team All-State honors on the defensive line. Leading the team again with 96 tackles in 11 games, he helped Mount Vernon to a 10-1 record.

In addition to football, Hormann was a standout in track and field, qualifying for state in both the shot put and discus. His throws of 51 feet 7 inches in shot put and 150 feet 8 inches in discus placed him among the top five in school history for at least 15 years. In 1985, Wayne participated in the Iowa Shrine Bowl, showcasing his talents alongside other top players from across the state.

After high school, Wayne signed a national letter of intent to play football at The University of Northern Iowa. However, after a knee injury, he transferred to Coe College, where he continued to play football for three years. His college career included strong performances on the defensive line, recording 44 tackles in 1987 and 37 tackles in 1988.

Even after his playing days ended, Wayne continued to contribute to the Mount Vernon football program. In 2007, he was selected as the second honorary player for the Mount Vernon High School football team. During his time, he also took on the role of weight room coach and assisted in coaching the 7th and 8th-grade football and shot put teams. He volunteered hours each summer helping with the speed and agility programs.

Said nominator Jeremy Hotz "Hormann has coached for the Mount Vernon Mustangs simply for the love of the game and program. During his time coaching, he has never once accepted or expected to be paid for any of his service, it has been entirely volunteer." Hormann's commitment to Mount Vernon athletics went beyond coaching. In 2014, he volunteered over 500 hours to help with the construction of the new bleachers at the First Street Field—a testament to his love for the sport and his community.

Through his playing and coaching career, Wayne Hormann's impact on Mount Vernon's football program and the wider community continues to be felt, proving that his legacy is much more than just numbers on a stat sheet. Said his wife Jodi, "Wayne is proud of his career at Mount Vernon, but if you asked him he would tell you that it was about being a team. It wasn't his statistic, it was the team statistic that is important to him. It's not the skills you have — it's how hard you work to improve the skills you have. It's about heart."




# **TouchPros** Screen

This year's Mount Vernon-Lisbon Community Development Group business of the year, White Tree Bakery (owned by Jen Juhl), views the accomplishment as another success for the business over the past three years. do so because of the visibility I have in Uptown."

Of course, operating a bakery comes with its own challenges – long hours and early mornings, all while balancing the other responsibilities of being a business owner and her personal life.

One of the things Juhl was recognized for was her support of the uptown businesses and festivals in Mount Vernon. For Juhl, that is just about being a great neighbor for so many other businesses.

"It feels amazing to be named business of the year by Mount Vernon-Lisbon Community Development Group," Juhl said. "I didn't think I'd be able to see such growth at such a rapid pace. After three years and three locations, I feel so happy that the community has supported me throughout."

White Tree Bakery started in Juhl's own kitchen as a hobby she started in her spare time, but as the community's support has grown, so has her footprint. In early 2023, she started a shop with traditional hours at First Street Community Center in uptown Mount Vernon and then moved into a space with larger foot traffic, stepping into the former The Nourishing Root and Big Creek Emporium space in late October.

"Having a business in uptown Mount Vernon has provided foot traffic that really accelerated my business this year," Juhl said. "People who wouldn't ordinarily stop at a bakery "Being part of Uptown allows me to collaborate with my neighbor businesses, like desserts at Little Scratch, gluten-free and vegan cupcakes at Plantiful Pantry, and desserts for Palisades Café," Juhl said. "The exposure this provides is great, but it's basically about being a great friend and neighbor, and helping provide something for their business that they

And part of growing her business with foot traffic has also been increasing her staff at the bakery. What just used to be Juhl and her immediate family helping with orders, has now grown to two regularly scheduled employees and seasonal help from area young adults, especially during Mount Vernon's

"We have a lot of fun here, but we also work very hard," Juhl said. "I'm hiring for a part-time bakery assistant, too, and look forward to finding our next team member."

For Juhl, though, the true cherry on top of this success has been the support she has from the community over the past three years. The support has allowed her to take baking from a part-time gig to a fully functioning bakery each week.

"My bakery is nothing without my repeat customers, people who drop in when their children and grandchildren are back in town, or for the families who stop in for a treat together," Juhl said. "My thanks for their support over the last three years is endless."

White Tree Bakery provided the cupcakes for the Alumni Centennial Theatre Reunion in July. When asked about the donation, Juhl noted her committed to Mount Vernon, the arts, and the Alumni.

In 2025, the Bakery will move into its new location at 117 1st St W, Mt Vernon, IA 52314 (the former Palisades Cafe.) The move will allow Juhl to expand her seating and menu offerings with a complete commercial kitchen.

#### ■ MAGGIE LESSMEIER WILLEMS '96

When wondering "Mustangs.. Where are they now?" you don't need to look far for Maggie Willems. After playing collegiate volleyball and coaching in Nebraska and in Williamsburg, IA,

Willems returned home to coach for Mount Vernon. Her successes at Mount Vernon have recently led to national accolades.

Willems served as an assistant coach for 6 years under the legendary Shirley Ryan. There have only been 2 head coaches in the history of the program, which started in 1973. As head coach, Willems led the Mustang team to

state tournaments 12 of her 14 years including two state championships in 2019 and again in 2024. Under her leadership, Mount Vernon has become a powerhouse producing twenty-two 3A All-State players, including three 3A All-State "Players of the Year." This year she coached the Mount Vernon team in the first outdoor volleyball match ever played in lowa in an exciting reverse-sweep victory against Manchester.

Maggie, though quick to give all of the credit to her students, is herself a star in the Volleyball world. She is the four-time lowa Girls Coach Association's 3A Coach of the Year, and this season reached 400 career wins. She was also named the Cedar Rapids Gazette

All-Area Coach of the Year.

Perhaps the ultimate recognition came when she was selected American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) Region 6 Coach of the Year. Willems was one of 31 coaches honored in the country. AVCA's coaches are a diverse group, as they represent teams from 24 states and a wide range of schools—large and small, urban and rural, public and private. Willems was recognized at the 2024 AVCA Convention in Louisville during the High School/Club Celebration in December 2024.

Back at home, Willems has been the club director for Mount Vernon Volleyball Club since 2012, providing developmental volleyball programming for athletes in the Mount Vernon community, beginning in the 4th grade. Club Volleyball typically serves 60-80 Mount Vernon volleyball athletes



#### MOUNT VERNON COMMUNITY BETTERMENT FUND AWARDS FIRST GRANT

Last year, retiring Community Foundation President & CEO Les Garner and his wife Katrina established two funds to benefit Mount Vernon. Anyone can now contribute to the Mount Vernon Community Betterment Today and Tomorrow Funds, which made their first grant earlier this year.

To ensure community voice was central to the grantmaking process, the Garners worked closely with Mayor Tom Wieseler when establishing the funds. After considering Mount Vernon's needs, population, and challenges, Tom assembled a committee to make decisions on distributing funds.

Soon after being formed, the committee was excited to begin the grantmaking process. The group quickly came to a consensus that a grant to the Mount Vernon Community School District would have the greatest impact and help meet a significant community need. As more and more families face economic hardship, a district program called Kids in Need helps yxouth access food, clothing, hygiene items, school supplies, and even extracurricular experiences.



"Kids in Need was started by a school nurse to provide kids with shoes, clothes, glasses, or other needed items," said Jenna Wear, Washington Elementary Nurse. The program has continued to grow and now provides a wide range of services, including meals and gifts around the holidays. "This grant was used to stock our supply cabinets with snacks, breakfast items, personal hygiene products of all types, and school supplies."

The Community Betterment Funds provide a way for Mount Vernon residents to raise and distribute funds in a way that fits their specific community. With both a "Today" and a "Tomorrow" fund, the grant committee can make grants in response to immediate needs while also knowing there will be long-term support for emerging needs.

"We are fortunate to have such a community fund that has long-term and short-term award components," Tom said. "I'm sure we will find uses for this fund that we haven't even thought of yet. While we hope it won't happen, if we are ever hit with tragedies, having these funds in place makes it easy to accept contributions."
