





### ■ COL. DEREK OAKLEY '92

Col. Derek Oakley '92 is commander of the 28th Bomb Wing, Ellsworth Air Force Base, South Dakota, the largest B-1 combat wing in the United States Air Force, with more than 12,000 active duty military, civilian employees, and family members. He provides combat-ready aircraft, crews and associated combat support for global engagement taskings.

"After I graduated from college, a fellow Mount Vernon classmate spoke with me about military service," said Oakley. "Through this conversation, I decided to join the Air Force and have enjoyed over 27 years of service to our country."

Col. Oakley earned a teaching degree before becoming a command pilot with more than 3,400 flight hours in the B-1B, T-38, T-6, and T-37, including 991 combat hours in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. Before becoming Commander, he led the 28th Operations Group at Ellsworth, the largest operational B-1B group in the U.S. Air Force.

He spent half his career flying the B-1 and the other half teaching new pilots He received his commission from the United States Air Force Officer Training School in 2000 and graduated from pilot training at Columbus AFB, Mississippi. He was operationally assigned to the B-1B.

He has served in a variety of flying squadrons as an instructor and evaluator pilot in the B-1B, T-6, and T-38. He commanded a T-6 squadron at Columbus AFB and served on the Joint Staff as the Director of the Joint Targeting School, Dam Neck Naval Air Station, Virginia. He served as the director of the  $\Breve{B}$ -21 Integration and System Management Office where he liaised between Air Force Global Strike Command and the Department of the Air Force Rapid Capabilities Office, supporting development of the B-21 Raider, the Air Force's Top 3 priority acquisition program.

"I was really lucky to get to fly the airplane I wanted to fly," he said of the B-1, which first came into service in the 1980s as a conventional supersonic bomber. It has been used to support missions in the Asia-Pacific region and Afghanistan. It does not carry nuclear weapons and about 60 remain in service at Dyess Air Force Base in Texas and Ellsworth.

Mount Vernon High School provided Oakley with the training to be a leader in his field. "Mount Vernon High School is a unique place where students can pursue a top-tier education while finding

their talents through participating in nearly any activity that piques their interest. I was a National Honor Society student, while able to participate in multiple sports (Cross Country, Wrestling, and Track), and tried chorus and school musicals. I was a team captain and state qualifier as both a team and individual in Cross Country, state qualifier as a team in Wrestling, and state event qualifier in Track. I was the KCRG "Athlete of the Week" where I won a thousand dollars for the Cross Country program, using those funds to purchase new uniforms."

Derek Oakley and his wife Kelly Britt Oakley 1993 are MVHS high school sweethearts. Their lives together include 28 years of marriage, two kids, and 14 military moves.

Derek moving so often is the opportunity to see the world. "Our kids have seen every zoo, museum, attraction," he said, laughing. "The ability to take normal vacations really doesn't exist. For many military members, our vacations are going back home to see family."

As a Colonel, Oakley has many responsibilities but continues to train new airmen. It's the mentoring and coaching DNA that runs in his blood, and he can't give that up even with his new responsibilities. It lines up with a long-term vision to be the best, and to train from the ground up.

He continues this teaching spirit in his new position as commander of the 28th Bomb Wing, Ellsworth Air Force. Oakley notes, "It's all about teaching, coaching, mentoring," he said. "I have the best job in the Air Force."

"My motto is 'win today, dominate tomorrow,'" Oakley said. "We need to be able to win today, and though we never want to go to war, we will defend our freedom if we are asked to do it. It's a mindset of doing better every day."

That's why it's important, he said, to keep investing in each airman and their families.

### ■ CAROL DEELY '82

On the one-year anniversary of losing their son Gabriel, Carol (Hufford, 1982) and Brendan Deely launched Gabriel's Light, a nonprofit organization with a mission to prevent youth suicide through mental health education that drives awareness and empowers action. The Deely family forever changed November 14, 2018, when they lost their 12-year-old son, Gabriel, to suicide. They're dedicated to sharing their family's story to encourage others to confront mental health challenges head-on — and over the past six years, their mission has had a powerful impact.

Every four days, an Illinois teen takes their life. (Illinois Department of Public Health). According to the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, suicide ranks as a leading cause of death for children ages 10 to 19 claiming more lives than any other major medical illness. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) also reports there are more than 3,700 suicide attempts each day nationally by students in grades 9-12. Four out of five of these teens give some sign of their intentions. The numbers would be higher if younger children were included.

The Gabriel's Light team addresses

Gabriel's Light educators encourage students to speak up and reach out to a trusted adult if they hear a classmate express feelings of worthlessness. They teach students to never joke about suicide. They emphasize the importance of sensitivity around the topic of suicide. Age-appropriate, hands-on activities teach younger children how to support themselves and friends in need. "We presented at a high school of 600 students, and 34 students asked for support," Carol says. "One student was transported that day to the emergency room, others were referred to mental health services and parents were called so they could get the care they needed right away."

"If we saved one life, that's one significant life, but we know it's many more than that," Carol says. "The silver lining of the pandemic is people are more willing to talk about mental health. We try to normalize asking for help as a sign of strength, not a weakness." Carol says one of the most rewarding aspects of Gabriel's Light is helping other families navigate the challenges of guilt and grief that survivors of suicide loss, like the Deely family, often experience. Gabriel's Light has brought their family peace through service. She says they are proud that this legacy

for Gabriel is making a difference in young lives. "In a very short period of time, they have built an effective foundation that has reached nearly 100,000 individuals," says Deborah R. Major, Director of Catholic Charities' Loving Outreach to Survivors of Suicide (LOSS) Program.

For their advocacy, courage, and commitment to preventing youth suicide, the Deely family will receive the 2025 Charles T. Rubey LOSS Award during the April 27 Blossoms of Hope brunch. To learn more about Gabriel's Light, go to www. gabrielslight.org.


